An often-overlooked aspect of God utilizing our circumstances is the importance of patience and trust. Early Christians, like those waiting in the Upper Room for the gift of the Holy Spirit, exemplify the virtue of trusting in God's timing. They remained in prayer and fellowship until they were endowed with power from on high Acts 1:13-14, 2:4. Trusting that God is at work, even when our circumstances don't seem to change immediately, nurtures a deeper faith and patience within us.
